



**2014 FIG Director Generals Forum
17th & 18th June 2014, Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre**

Preamble

The Annual FIG Director Generals Forum brings together Chief Executives or Director Generals (or their representatives or nominees) of national (or provincial) agencies within the land sector that has responsibility over mapping, cadastral, valuation, land administration and management from around the world. The Forum allows peer-to-peer engagement to address the challenges and seek approaches to secure, support, sustain and safeguard land and property rights, stimulating social and economic development and poverty alleviation.

Introduction

The Forum provides a major opportunity within the XXV FIG Congress for FIG Affiliate Members and leaders of these national (or provincial) land sector agencies to converge and contribute their experiences and observations, to discuss and design new approaches that can enhance land sector related services, and in particular, availing these services more universally, efficiently and cost effectively, approaches that adopt and adapt available, appropriate and affordable technologies, methodologies and processes.

Global Land Tool Network (GLTN) as facilitated by UN-Habitat is main institutional supporter of the 2014 FIG Director Generals Forum. GLTN is an alliance of global and regional partners contributing to poverty alleviation through land reform, improved land management and security of tenure particularly through the development and dissemination of pro-poor and gender-sensitive land tools.

Within FIG, we recognize that Land (and the seas, inland waters, the natural resources and structures there on) remains capable of generating opportunities for the betterment and wellbeing of all. The availability of varying types information with location and temporal context almost round the clock, are challenging national agencies in an era where processes are increasingly modular and mobile. There are appropriate technologies and platforms today, together with institutional and legal capacities, fresh and innovative approaches, which should allow national agencies to remain relevant, supporting and sustaining land administration and management. Many a national agency remains challenged to stay relevant, deliver its core mandates efficiently and cost effectively, as well as to further generate opportunities, and business-as-usual no longer is an option.

With the theme “Engaging the Challenges; Enhancing the Relevance”, the Forum intends to draw upon appropriate experiences and good practices to further improved efficiency and better governance within the land sector. Enhancing effectiveness of land sector agencies is necessary as the Post-2015 Development Agenda is on our horizon.
